Direct Entry - An answer to Nova Scotia's skilled trades shortage

Nova Scotia desperately needs more skilled trades professionals.

Here's how that can happen: **Direct Entry** and **Enhanced Direct Entry**, where candidates earn while they learn – Tool Time versus School Time. In todays' tight labour market for skilled tradespeople, the new emerging trend is **Direct Entry** – the best opportunity for those who are ready to start a skilled trades career - today.

The Building Trades Advancement College (BTAC) is the largest private sector training program in Nova Scotia – For the Trades and By the Trades. Seven campuses operated by 13 Building Trades Unions representing over 12,000 of Nova Scotia's Industrial/Commercial/Institutional (ICI) Skilled Tradespeople in partnership with our 350 ICI Contractors.

BTAC offers direct entry opportunities for over 20 different skilled trades. Training is provided by trades professionals for the specific skills required by our contractors to minimize non-essential in-class time, so candidates get started right away, learning productive, safe work methods.

More pluses - most of this training is free and, as a member of the Building Trades Unions, tradespeople earn above average wages with full benefits and a pension.

With a few short weeks of training (depending on the trade), candidates can progress to learning on the job. When dispatched to the job, supervision, mentorship, on-the-job training and ongoing technical training are in place to support them throughout their apprenticeship journey.

Direct entry with enhanced direct entry training gets tradespeople on the job quickly – where they are needed.

In the coming weeks BTAC will continue to expand and promote direct entry opportunities to fulfill our mandate to supply the best and safest tradespeople to meet the growing needs of our Nova Scotia contractors.

- BTAC is operated by the Building Trades Unions of Nova Scotia in partnership with 350 ICI contractors and is part of a national network of 175 training centers and over 500,000 unionized trades professionals represented by the Canadian Building Trades Unions.

- The Building Trades Unions Tradespeople are 31% safer.*

- The Building Trades Unions employ the majority of the construction apprentices in Nova Scotia and have the highest retention and completion rates in the industry.
